

Highlights from ABWOTS Annual Leadership Seminar

On Tuesday April 29th in Charlotte, North Carolina, we held our ABWOTS Annual Leadership Seminar and Business Meeting as a part of the ABCOTS 55th Annual Session. Our theme for the program was "Welcoming the Stranger". Our theme scriptures were from Matthew 25: 35 & Hebrews 13: 2, NIV. Our three speakers were excellent, inspirational, and motivational. The women were empowered by their presentations as they provided valuable information, and new perspectives for professional growth or problem-solving (photos on pages 5-6). We were truly blessed by the skills, gifts, and talents of these women.

Speaker Descriptions

Rev. LaThelma Armstrong is the Executive Director of American Baptist Women's Ministries. She is a dynamic leader and trailblazer in ministry, making history as the first African American pastor of Flemington Baptist Church in Flemington, NJ. Before stepping into this role, she served as the Associate Executive Director of American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM) where she empowered communities of faith-filled and justice-driven women and girls. During her presentation Rev. Armstrong encouraged women to be strong and courageous and to "take up space" in this world. She emphasized the importance of belonging and getting involved in improving our communities.

Ms. Kimberly Pennamon is a Social Skills Coach and Career Counselor for clients with intellectual and developmental disabilities. She also serves as a volunteer mediator for the Montgomery County Commission on Common Ownership Communities (CCOC). She is a trained arbitrator and is a Registered Neutral (Mediator) for the Georgia Supreme Court Commission. She is a new member of the Mount Calvary Baptist Church in Rockville, Maryland where she serves as a teacher for Youth Church and member of the Health & Wellness Ministry and Mental Health Team. Ms. Pennamon spoke about the importance of mindfulness to our spiritual and emotional well being.

Ms. Kellee Helton Hicks' career began at Mecklenburg County Department of Social Services in the Youth and Family Services Division, where she served as a Senior Social Worker in the Investigations unit; worked as a Social Work Supervisor, overseeing a team of Investigative and In-Home Social Workers. Currently, she serves as a Director of Program Services at the Salvation Army Center of Hope Homeless Shelter, where she provides leadership and oversight of the Social Services department. As representative of the Center of Hope, our mission outreach recipient organization for 2025, Ms. Hicks provided information about their programs and graciously accepted the generous donations from our churches throughout the region.

Leadership Seminar Evaluation Results

We sincerely appreciated your participation in the women's programs and your valuable feedback in the evaluations. Most of your responses indicated the event met or exceeded your expectations. The most positive feedback was on the speakers and content of the leadership seminar. Respondents thought the speakers were very good and the topics were appropriate and relevant. The participants were very pleased with the meeting space and the church facilities. The Pastor and staff at Mount Carmel Baptist Church were gracious and welcoming. Overall, the women appreciated the opportunity to meet and fellowship with our sisters from across the region.

Suggestions for improving the program included:

- better allocation of time for the Leadership Seminar since some respondents felt the speakers did not have enough time,
- the time schedule should be monitored and adhered to during the seminar and business meeting,
- participants really appreciated the Silver+ Recognition being included in the program,
- ABWOTS expense budget line items should be more descriptive to focus on the nature or type of expense and purpose rather than who incurred the expense.

Suggested topics for future seminars included:

- more training or information about the duties of the ABWOTS Executive Committee,
- provide suggestions and ideas about ABW Ministry programs,
- more discussions to strengthen women overall.
